Summarise the whole topic back into a concise short overview

STEP I write the practice exam question in full, highlight command terms in one colour and circle terminology that requires response

Space for your question response

Refer to the numerical mark weight – write length appropriately

When complete highlight where you have responded to command terms, circle mirroring terminology, and underline the parts that respond to the question

STEP 3

Use the rubric, criteria, assessors feedback to write points that support positive marks, also write points that would affect full marks

Try an make the notes as complete as possible, abbreviate, paraphrase full ideas but don't skip key points, include quotes, terminology and subject specific words

Return to your text or body of content and write short points that were missed
