Driven by an idea of one parent at Xavier College and a commitment to supporting young people experiencing homelessness, this program has transformed the lives of many young individuals through the mentoring program. Volunteer mentors from the XSJN, many from diverse professional backgrounds, have become invaluable role models to the young people from the Foyer, as well as have been enriched through their witnessing of the resilience and strength of these young people. The Vinnies Soup Van Program is another wonderful successful partnership that the XSJN has had over many years, which is attributed mostly to the long-standing late Soup Van leader, Leo Holt. The XSJN not only provided many volunteers to the Soup Vans, but also purchased a Soup Van vehicle for the Collingwood Soup Van and instigated the 'donate a night on the Soup Van' raising significant funds for the running of the Soup Vans. Parents and OX continue to volunteer on the Soup Vans regularly.

With a commitment to flexibility and innovative program offerings, the network ensures ongoing engagement for all ages.
