Current Climate

War in the Ukraine is one of the most significant refugee crises in recent times. It is Europe's worst refugee crisis since the Balkan wars of the 1990s. What does this mean?



84 million people are currently displaced worldwide. This number has doubled in the last decade.

War in Ukraine has grabbed the world's attention and spotlighted the problems facing people seeking asylum. Without downplaying the importance of continuing our support to Ukraine, we would like to remind you that as of mid 2021, more than **two thirds of all refugees** that were displaced abroad came from just **five countries**:

- Syrian Arab Republic 6.8 million
- Venezuela 4.1 million
- Afghanistan 2.6 million
- South Sudan 2.2 million
- Myanmar 1.1 million

2022-23 BUDGET

\$482.5 million is allocated by the Australian government for its offshore processing policy in 2022-23 despite having just 112 refugees and asylum seekers currently being held in Nauru.

\$9.65 billion will be the total cost of offshore processing by 2023.

\$20 million is going to be the budget of Australian Human Rights Commission in 2025-26. It will be cut by a third.

In his victory speech, the 31st Prime Minister of Australia, Anthony Albanese, said that "we should always look after the disadvantaged and the vulnerable" and "no one should be held back because we should always support aspiration and opportunity."

We want to hold our new government to its promises, abolish Temporary Protection Visas and Safe Haven Enterprise Visas, and provide pathways to permanent protection. As a record number of people are being displaced worldwide, we want to encourage the new government to help develop a constructive global response to the refugee tide.

We celebrated the release of 26 refugees from onshore detention on the 7-8th April 2022, joining around 250 people released since December 2020. An estimated 5 to 6 people transferred from

offshore detention for medical reasons were still in detention as of April 2022. There are still over 200 people being held in the offshore processing facilities^{*}.

*The Department of Home Affairs doesn't publish the number of people held in PNG since the arrangement with PNG ended
